



## **Call for Submissions to the 2018 HarperCollins*PublishersLtd*/UBC Prize for Best New Fiction**

**Open to current students and alumni of the UBC Creative Writing Program**

In 2013 HarperCollins*PublishersLtd*, The University of British Columbia Creative Writing Program and CookeMcDermid (then The Cooke Agency) launched a prize for new fiction written by students and alumni of the university's prestigious creative writing course. The first five years of the prize have culminated in an impressive list of winners, including forthcoming novels THE GHOST KEEPER by Natalie Morrill and THE DUTCH WIFE by Ellen Keith.

After a one year hiatus, we are pleased to be administering the sixth edition of the now biannual Prize and to announce this year's call for submissions. Submissions open at 12:01AM PDT on Monday, April 30, 2018 and will close at 11:59PM PDT on Monday, July 2nd. The HarperCollins*PublishersLtd*/UBC Prize for Best New Fiction awards a contract for representation by CookeMcDermid and a contract from HarperCollins*PublishersLtd* for publication of the winning novel or short story collection.

The Rules and Regulations govern administration of the prize only and are separate from the publishing and agency contracts which are industry standard and offer a great opportunity to launch a writing career with a major literary agency and one of Canada's leading publishing companies.

The shortlist for this year's prize will be notified by August 31, 2018 and the winner will be notified by October 15, 2018. We would like to thank you for participating in this year's

competition and are looking forward to reading your work. The challenge of selecting a winner is sure to be a rewarding task.
